

SciFest@School

On Thursday 26th April 2012 Fingal Community College one of eleven schools in the country hosted a new initiative called SciFest@School which was sponsored by Intel. The aim of SciFest is to encourage a love of science and maths through active collaborative, inquiry-based learning and to provide a forum for students at local or regional level to present and display their scientific investigations. The SciFest competition is similar in structure to the BT Young Scientist but held at a variety of Institutes of Technology in Ireland.

Due to the enormous interest in science from 1st, 2nd and 5th Year students in Fingal Community College we were in a position to hold an exhibition in our school hall which displayed 44 projects from 86 students. The top five ranking projects went on to represent Fingal Community College at Blanchardstown IT on 9th May.

The school hall was transformed to display the exhibiting projects and a fun zone provided various science games, puzzles and brain teasers to educate and entertain the visiting primary school students. Fingal Community College was pleased to welcome over 400 students from 5th and 6th class from the following local primary schools; Swords Educate Together, St. Colmcille's Girl's National School, St. Colmcille's Boy's National School and Holy Family National School.
